## Girls and young women statistics in Mozambique



- ◆ Mozambique is a country located in southern Africa; it has borders with six other countries and more than 2,500 km of Indian Ocean coastline.
- ◆ Its population is strikingly young: children and youths accounting for 65% of the total population
- ◆ People aged 15-24 living in rural areas: 63%
- ◆ The percentage of poor people living in poverty is still around 55 per cent.
- ◆ Illiteracy: 47% among young women against 25% in young men.
- ◆ Girls 15-19 years who completed Primary/ Secondary Education: 13,2%/ 1,2%
- ◆ The feminization of the HIV epidemic in Mozambique is exemplified by the fact that more women than men are living with the virus and young women are three times more likely to be infected by the virus than young boys (11.1 per cent compared to 3.7 per cent).
- ◆ Increased natural disasters magnitude and frequency induce higher risk of internal
