Activities in Cabo Delgado

From January 2021 to July 2022

More than **59,000 women and girls** in Cabo Delgado and Niassa have been directly reached through mobile brigades, which provide life-saving sexual and reproductive health and gender-based violence prevention and response services, information and support.

3 health facilities were furnished and equipped with the necessary resources to provide the following services: Antenatal Care, Postnatal Care, Family Planning, and Maternal Death Auditing

36 cases of gender-based violence have been efficiently managed by newly trained activists from partner organizations, providing psychosocial support and facilitating referrals to other essential GBV services (e.g., health and legal services).

Developing Context in the North

1.5 million people need life-saving and life-sustaining humanitarian assistance in 2022.

Of whom (MISP calculations, UNFPA):

- 360,000 women of reproductive age are at risk of not accessing SRH services if no action is taken
- 42,500+ are pregnant
- 2,100+ will experience complications in the next 3 months without urgent interventions
- 7,200 women face the risk of sexual violence without adequate care if no action is taken (MISP calculations)

Nearly 1 million people are internally displaced across five provinces in the north. **80%** are women and children (OCHA, June 2022).

PROJECT INFORMATION

The project focuses on scaling-up life-saving sexual and reproductive health and gender-based violence services for the most vulnerable women and girls in Northern Mozambique.

The project supports training on SRH and GBV, including referral pathways for services, the procurement of medical equipment and supplies, and the provision of remote-based care and female dignity kits for girls and young women affected by the humanitarian crisis.

59,000+ Women of reproductive age in Cabo Delgado and Niassa have received a form of modern contraception, including condoms.
